

A REFLECTION FROM JIM HOGAN... What Tiggers Do Best

"I came so that they might have life and have it more abundantly" (In 10:10). But the most wonderful thing about tiggers is I'm the only one I'm the only one!

He is a salve for the depressed and melancholy. He remains happily ever vigilant - a silly, silent sentinel in a child's nursery. The more hours we commit to working and frowning, the more this character's whimsical visage looms in our conscious memory, a symbol against a culture which takes itself entirely too seriously. For somewhere above our work-a-day grimaces, fast food fatigue, and nihilistic loneliness... lies Tigger. "Tiggers never go on being Sad," explained Rabbit.

Tigger rejoices in his individuality: "the most wonderful thing about Tiggers is I'm the only one." The world can talk of reincarnation and cloning all it likes, but Tigger knows he is unique and irreplaceable, as are each of us (if we only knew it). Tigger sees this as cause for celebration, rather than alienation. The only "blackness" in his world is his stripes.

Tigger needs no reason to enjoy life other than the simple fact that he is alive, unlike so many in today's world who assume that life owes them amusement and are as glum as Eeyore when the world does not oblige. Those who live to be entertained have lost the art of living. Francis of Assisi said, "Blessed is he who expects nothing, for he shall enjoy everything." In Francis' conversations with woodland animals, he must have spoken to Tigger, because like Francis before him, Tigger does not require possessions to be happy. For Tigger, breathing is cause enough for festivity. He need not own the hundred-acre wood in order to enjoy it. Nor does he seek a gold medal in Olympic "bouncing." Bouncing is sufficient in itself. Don't be ridick-orous. Tiggers only bounce up!

Tigger lives the right-side-up Gospel of fun. We, on the other hand, are upside-down. We ask God for all things, so that we may enjoy life. God gives us life, so that we may enjoy all things.

Whereas tigers possess a formidable sense of smell, Tigger possesses an even more valuable sense — a sense of humor. We are the only creatures on this planet who laugh. A laughing hyena, despite its name, does not laugh any more than a praying mantis prays. Only mankind can "get the joke" about the universe, for we are the only ones who are at odds with it. We laugh about earthy things because we are uneasy with our earthly nature. Humor arises out of our uncomfortableness with ourselves. C.S. Lewis observed: "The coarse joke proclaims that we have here an animal which finds its own animality either objectionable or funny. Unless there had been a quarrel between the spirit and the organism, I do not see how this could be: it is the very mark of the two not being 'at home' together."

Humor is the balm of the soul that protects us from taking this world and ourselves too seriously. Just as antibodies fight viral infections, humor fights off the sin of worldliness and deadly pride. There is a spiritual interrelationship between humor, humility, and humanity. Laughter truly is the best medicine. He who laughs, lasts.

We laugh at a man who slips on a banana peel, hopefully not because he got hurt, but because he got humbled. Our emotional distance from his discomfort gives us the opportunity to observe the awkward silliness of his and our own humanity. As G.K. Chesterton commented, "All the jokes... are really theological jokes; they are a paradox that man is superior to all the things around him and yet is at their mercy." Humor is the good-natured side of truth.

This explains why we sometimes laugh in moments that are most somber. Our spirit rails against the seriousness of this world overwhelming us. A person with a good sense of humor does not deny the earnestness of life; he seeks only to rise above it. Considering the much-prized trophy of success, Samuel Goldwyn advised, "Sincerity is the key. If you can fake that, you've got it made." Concerning the somber issue of physical health, Mark Twain retorted, "Every time I feel the urge to exercise, I lie down until it goes away." Commenting on the sacred institution of marriage, said Groucho Marx, "Marriage is a wonderful institution, but who wants to live in an institution?" Regarding the foreboding reality of death, Woody Allen said, "I don't mind death, I just don't want to be around when it happens." Humor is not a denial of solemnity; it is a curative response to the pressure life places on our soul. Like Simon of Cyrene, humor lightens the burden of the crosses we shoulder.



Laughter is a sacred thing. Abraham must have known that, for he did not name his first-born son, "smile." Instead, he named him isaac, which means "laughter." An optimistic fad of the 1970s was wearing yellow "smile buttons," but maybe what we need today are "laugh buttons," for a smile is only the seed of humor, not its flowering. A smile is tame. A laugh is wild. A smile is controlled. A laugh is spontaneous. A smile is secretive. A laugh is infectious. A laugh is vulnerability, a secret revealed — a joyful explosion from inside that cannot be contained, that must be expressed.

The craftsmanship of laughter is comedy. In the humbling act of telling a joke, we echo our God who proclaims life the divine comedy. Creation itself is a cosmic laugh from the breath of the comic Creator. All the universe is an expression of God's whimsy. In our small moments of humility, we connect with our God who humbled Himself to share in our humanity – a king who became a court jester, a prince in a pauper's gown. To win back joy from the clutches of sorrow, He stooped to conquer; He traded His crown for thorns and His scepter for a cross, suffering humiliation on the Place of the Skull. But comedy is in the timing. Wait for the punchline. Incarnate God would not allow death to steal the show, for the Resurrection is the last laugh and our God, who laughs last, laughs best. We need not be grave anymore, for He has conquered the grave. The Resurrection marks the transformation of life from tragedy to comedy. Living the lightness of Christ's light, we can bounce through our days like Tigger, with a happy disposition, our feet no longer dragging in the dirt.

Come on, try it! It makes ya feel just grrreat!

It is time that Christianity reclaimed fun. Fun is a conversion-arrow that belongs in the Christian quiver. As Pope John XXIII reminded us, the only good argument against Christianity is joyless Christians.

Just as Christopher Robin Milne listened intently to his father's nursery tale years ago, somewhere, a small child snuggles comfortably next to his mother, with blanket in hand, listening to the second chapter of The House at Pooh Corner. He follows the adventures of Tigger as the gang tries to discover what Tiggers like best. No, not honey, not haycorns, not thisties. It appears that even Tigger does not know. The chapter ends without an answer, the mystery unsolved - a very disquieting ending for any serious grown-up. But the child is unconcerned. For a child is less interested in what Tiggers like best and more interested in what he likes best about Tigger. Deep in the innocence of children, the answer is simple: Tigger is fun. And maybe that is what Tiggers like best.

Well, I gotta go now. I've got a lotta bouncin' to do! Hoo-hoo-hoo! T-T-F-N: ta-ta for now!






